Task: Write a five-sentence story with the title: 'The Exam'. Each sentence should have a particular function. Take a look at the table below.

You may wish to set it out in your book like this:

SENTENCE 1: <u>Exposition</u> introduce	
your characters and setting.	
SENTENCE 2: <u>Rising Action</u>	
There is a rise in tension and	
something happens that disrupts the	
normal way of things.	
SENTENCE 3: <u>Climax</u>	
This is the 'big moment' in your story	
– the moment of highest tension!	
SENTENCE 4: Falling Action	
The story moves closer to the end, the	
resolution.	
SENTENCE 5: The Resolution	
We come to a satisfying close.	

Extension: Turn this five-sentence story into a longer story!



Write a story opening using the title: 'The Door'

You are going to focus on how you can create an interesting opening to hook the reader. Choose one of the following ways to open a story:

Pose a question: Ever wondered what life would look like from a door's perspective?

Introduce a character: The owner of the door in question was rather eccentric. Lay clues about the direction the story is going to take: Doors witness everything. Nothing like that though. That was unforgivable.

An arresting line of dialogue: "Get out of my house!"
