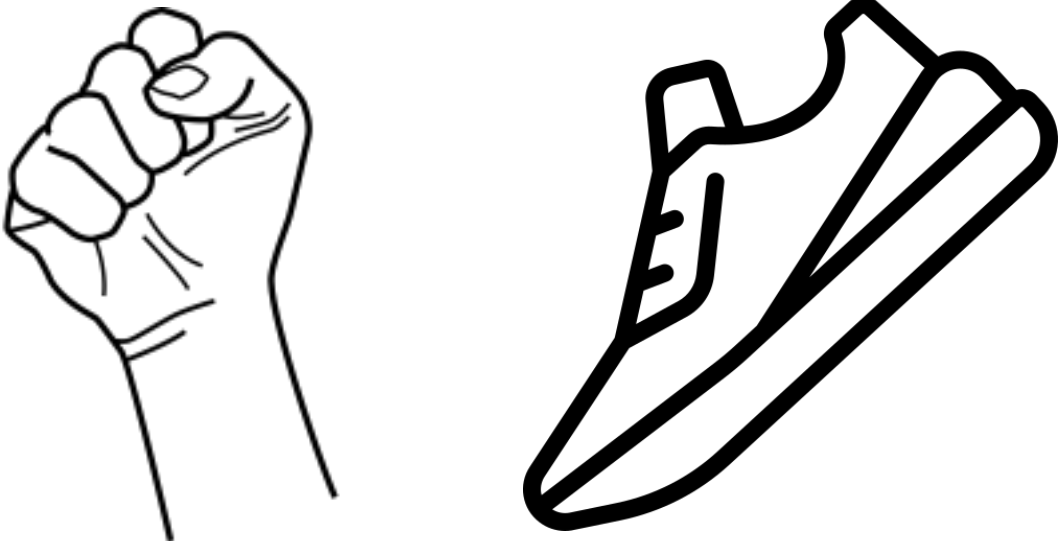


Run Rebel Extension Homework Tasks



Each week, your class teacher will set you some 'Run Rebel' reading to do at home. Your class teacher will quiz you in class to make sure that you have completed and understood the reading.

If you would like to do more, then here are some weekly extension tasks! They are completely optional.

Week 1

Create your own rebellious character and then write a description of them entering a room.

Step 1: Make a list of traits that makes your character rebellious.

Step 2: Write a descriptive paragraph.

For example:

- Thinks outside the box
- Attends protests
- Disagrees with people
- Wants their voice to be heard
- Calls out injustice
- Dreams of a more just future
- Dislikes rules

Suddenly, the atmosphere changed. Enter the girl that made sparks fly. Enter the girl that left a trail of fire in her wake. Enter the girl that was unashamedly electric. Nothing, or no one, could contain such blazing flames; she was going to set the world alight.

Week 2
