Yr 11 to Yr 12 Transition Work: Economics

The social sciences (Economics, Criminology, Sociology, Psychology, Law) share a common approach to study. You are required to demonstrate your knowledge and understanding of the topics, to apply what you have learned to novel situations and to analyse, evaluate and justify.

KS5 courses are a step up from the way you have worked at GCSE. These tasks are designed to help you prepare you for this way of working.

Assess what the main challenges are facing the UK economy at the moment?

<u> Task 2</u>

Why can we access the likes of education, healthcare etc., free of charge, but other items are heavily taxed, such as petrol, alcohol? Is this the best approach?

What should I be thinking about when answering these questions?

- Research the economic ideas and theories behind these questions: remember, to think like an economist!
- Write clearly:
 - Introduction
 - Make your points
 - Explain clearly: use examples where you can
 - Evaluate: what are both sides of the argument? Can you come to an overall conclusion?
