1. Rebellion	When the people protest and fight back against their rulers (the people in charge).	
2. Castle	A fortress built by the Normans to keep order	
3. Motte and Bailey Castle	A medieval castle with two main parts: a raised earthen mound called a motte, and an enclosed courtyard called a bailey. Having structures such as barracks, stables, and tower keep.	
4. Feudal system	The system by which Norman society ran. This depended on the granting of land for loyalty and military services, was another way for the king to control the population.	
5. Barons	One of the leading figures in Norman England. The king's chief supporters and helped the King control the country by owning land.	
6. Domesday Book	A book that recorded the land holdings for the whole of England to decide how much tax they should pay and who should fight.	
7. Harrying	Persistently carry out attacks on (an enemy or an enemy's territory).	
8. Church	A) The organisation that governs Christianity. B) The building where Christians worship.	
9. Monk	Someone who devotes their whole life to God, lives in a closed-off community and spends their days in prayer.	
10. Annihilate	To completely destroy something.
